To keep groups small at this time, we are splitting the ORT into two groups. One group will run in the morning and one in the afternoon. This is the same ORT so handlers can enter only one dog.

AM session: 9:00 AM – 12:15 PM

PM session: 1:30 PM – 4:45 PM

Opening Date: Wednesday, May 15, 2024 at 9:00 AM PDT

Entries Close: Monday, July 29, 2024 at 9:00 AM PDT or when entry limits have been met

Second Dog Policy: No Second dog entries. One dog per handler.

NOTE: PLEASE BE AWARE THAT YOU MUST RENEW YOUR NACSW MEMBERSHIP FOR THE 2024-2025 MEMBERSHIP YEAR TO HAVE A QUALIFIED ENTRY IN THE ORT.

Entry Method

Entries are to be made online at www.gentlepets.com/events.

- **ENTRIES MUST BE MADE ON THE ONLINE ENTRY FORM.**
- **ORT participants must be CURRENT members and must have completed a 2024-2025 membership or renewal.**
- **REMINDER: you will need your NACSW Member Number and your dog's NACSW K9 number to register.**
- No entry shall be made and no entry shall be accepted, which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance.
- Owners are responsible for errors in making out entry forms.

Entry Requirements

A Qualified Entry is one that meets all the following criteria:

- Complete entry during the specified entry time frame.
- **The Handler is a NACSW member for the 2024-2025 membership year (8/1/24- 7/31/25).**
- The Dog is registered with the NACSW.
- Dogs participating in an Odor Recognition Test (ORT) must be at least six months of age.

For Exhibit Only Dogs (FEO): Dogs running FEO are not eligible to receive titles. FEO results will not be included in the posted ORT results. If space remains after all qualified entries are accommodated on July 29, 2024, then we will offer spaces for those who wish to run a dog (FEO). Dogs may only run FEO in odors that they are *not* already registered for.

Trial Eligibility and ORTs

The ORT Title must be earned at least 14 days before a trial opening date to be eligible for the first draw period.

All odors must be passed in order to earn the ORT title. It is not required that they all be passed at the same test.

Notification

Acknowledgement of entry acceptance/confirmation will be made by email when entries are processed. Your payment receipt and notification is confirmation of your completed entry.

Basic Description of the Test

To successfully pass an ORT a dog must identify the location of the target odor and the handler must correctly call an “alert” within a three-minute time period. The Odor Recognition Test consists of a drill type exercise which requires 12 closed boxes typically set up in a pattern of two rows, spaced a minimum of 48” apart. The ORT is conducted on leash. Complete information can be obtained on the NACSW website. Handlers may test on all 3 odors at the same event.

*All exhibitors should obtain and review a copy of the **NACSW K9 NOSE WORK® RULE BOOK**. You may get it from their website: www.NACSW.net*

No dog will be given more than one space in the same odor test at a single event.

The following cancellation policy applies:

For cancellation of entries on or before 5:00 PM PDT August 1, 2024 – Full refund minus \$10 processing fee per odor will be issued. For cancellation of entries after 5:00 PM PDT August 1, 2024 – no refunds will be issued.

All cancellations must be sent by email to teah@gentlepets.com. You will receive a reply email within 5 days at the latest.

Entry fees shall not be refunded if a dog or handler is absent, disqualified, or excused by the NACSW official or judge.

This cancellation and refund policy applies to handlers that must withdraw for any reason including but not limited to injury, illness, emergency, and personal or work-related reasons.

If the event cannot take place or be completed by reason of fire, civil disturbances, an Act of God, public emergency, or any other cause beyond the control of the event organizers, then the event host will make their

best effort to provide partial refunds after recouping their expenses.

Test Site Hours

8:30 AM – 5:00 PM

We are running the same ORT split into two sessions to keep groups small and allow you to complete your ORT in a half day. (No second dog entries). Select your choice of AM/PM session on the registration form. One Orientation will be held for all three odors at the start time for each session (9:00 AM and 1:30 PM)

AM session: 9:00 AM – 12:15 PM

Check-in time: AM 8:30 AM

PM session: 1:30 PM – 4:45 PM

Check-in time: PM 1:00 PM

ADA Site Specific Conditions

The test will be held inside the training center. The surface is textured vinyl flooring. The parking area is road base (gravel). The main entrance is from the back of the building with stairs. We have a ramp available to enter the building from the front and limited parking in front. If you need this accommodation, please let teah@gentlepets.com know.

Due to unforeseen conditions, such as weather or change in availability of areas at the location, these conditions may be modified at the last minute.

Modeled after real-life detection work, NACSW events are held in many different locations, with a variety of terrain, under varying weather conditions. Dogs and handlers need to be able to safely negotiate a variety of surfaces, including, but not limited to, tile, linoleum, carpeting, gravel, asphalt, uneven surfaces, and slippery footing. Handlers should be prepared to deal with a variety of weather conditions, including heat, cold, rain and snow. Events frequently require covering extensive distances to get to and from the parking area to each of the search areas and generally require that this be done across natural, uneven surfaces. Handlers should be prepared for the physical demands and must be able to navigate the terrain with their dog accordingly. Handlers should expect to spend most of the day outside or in their vehicles as there are rarely indoor crating options at events. Please be prepared for you and your canine partner to deal with all of these varying environmental challenges. Handlers should familiarize themselves with potential regional risks and health concerns that may affect themselves or their dogs. Handlers agree that they are entering this event at their own risk.

Due to unforeseen conditions, such as weather or change in availability of areas at the location, the details below may need to be modified at the last minute.

Parking

The parking lot is road base (gravel) with no shade available. We have limited parking in front for those that need disabled access (ramp) to the building.

RV Parking

We have limited parking and can accommodate only vehicles that can fit in a standard parking space. Large RVs can't be accommodated. Please contact teah@gentlepets.com if you are unsure about parking.

Running Vehicles or Generators in the parking lot

The parking is tight at this location and running your vehicles or generators in the parking lot is not allowed at this event. (Of course, unless they are electric vehicles.)

Reactive Dog Parking

There will be limited reactive dog parking at this test for those who wish to park in this area. We will have a separate potty area for reactive dogs. However, the parking is tight and there will not be separate warm up boxes.

Unentered Dogs

Unentered dogs must remain in the competitor's vehicle during the test day. There will be ample potty areas, but unentered dogs should not be allowed to "play", exercise, or train on the test grounds.

Facility/Site Prohibitive Restrictions (e.g., smoking, firearms, alcohol, drugs, video)

Smoking is not allowed on this test site, including the use of e-cigarettes.

Alcohol is not allowed on this event site.

Firearms are prohibited on the property.

Dog Policies

- All dogs must be on a 6' leash at all times when not searching. NO flexi-leashes while not participating in a search.
- Reactive and/or spatially challenged dogs should wear a red bandana (to be provided by the dog's handler) to help signal others that the dog needs extra space from other dogs.
- Dogs will be toileted in designated areas and handlers must pick-up and dispose of waste.
- Dogs and handlers must stay in designated areas to avoid contaminating search space, interrupting a search, or from viewing any part of the searching.
- Handlers should expect to keep their dogs confined in a crate or vehicle when not searching. The logistics of an event typically do not allow for dogs to hang out on leash in between searches. Handlers should plan to provide their own shade using canopies or shade cloths.
- Refer to location details (above) for information on unentered dogs.

Females in Season

Females in season will be allowed to run wearing "pants" at the very end of the day after all other dogs have tested. Handlers with females in season should park and toilet their dogs away from the other dogs if the location logistics permit. Handlers must email the teah@gentlepets.com so plans can be made for the dog.

COVID-19 Information

Event attendees are required to adhere to the NACSW [COVID-19 Event Guidelines and Rules](#)

In addition to those guidelines the following changes and guidelines are in effect for this test due to COVID-19.

County regulations currently follow State of California guidelines.

Handlers are asked to bring their own hand sanitizer and disinfectant wipes.

If there are any significant changes or updates after the draw period, handlers will be notified via email.

Handlers are responsible for staying up to date on any jurisdictional requirements for their home location as well as the event location including any travel guidance.

Rules

Complete rules are available at www.NACSW.net. **It is the responsibility of each handler to read and understand the current NACSW™ Rule book prior to participating in a NACSW event.**

Liability

By registering for the ORT Test, the handler hereby assumes all risks of, and responsibility for, accidents and/or damage to her/himself or to her/his property or to others, resulting from the actions of her/his dog. The handler expressly agrees that the NACSW, Son Care Foundation, Inc., DBA Gentle Touch Pet Training and its assignees or any other person, or persons, of said groups, shall not be held liable personally, or collectively, under any circumstances, for injury, and/or damage to her/himself, for loss or injury to property, whether due to uncontrolled dogs or negligence of any member of said groups, or any other cause, or causes. The handler also agrees to assume all financial liability that may be incurred by the NACSW due to the actions of themselves or their dogs regardless of the cause.

Sportsmanship

All handlers and spectators are expected to follow the rules of the NACSW and demonstrate good sportsmanship. This includes making sure the hide placements are unknown to the handler prior to searching and kept secret from other handlers. Please do not discuss hide placement or any details of a dog's performance that may provide information or clues to other handlers or may be overheard.

Results

During the odor re-sets, the official results sheet will be brought out to the parking area for handlers to photo or review. We recommend you verify your results on the official results sheet and let your host or judge know if you have any questions regarding your results.

Spectators

Spectators are reminded that the hide placements must not be discussed nor should they speak with any handlers about what they saw until after the event is complete.

ORT participants may have a friend or family member video/photograph their test. ORT participants may not video/photograph one another. Handlers are not allowed to watch the searches at any time.

No dogs will be allowed in the spectator area. An adult accompanying a minor must be present during the searches. Children under 18 must always be directly supervised by a parent/guardian on event grounds.

Everyone at the site must sign the waiver provided by the host and comply with all event requirements.

Videotaping and Photography

If the site allows public video to be taken, handlers may wear visible head or chest cameras to record their searches. You will not be allowed extra time at the start line to get your camera functioning. Please be sure it is ready to go prior to arriving at the search area. At ORTs, handlers may bring a spectator to video or photograph their searches. Videos may not be made public until completion of the event day.

At the host's discretion, a photographer and/or video service may be present during the event to offer photos and/or videos for sale to the handlers. Professional Video &/or Photography service listed below will be taking video of the searches. Details will be available at check in.
